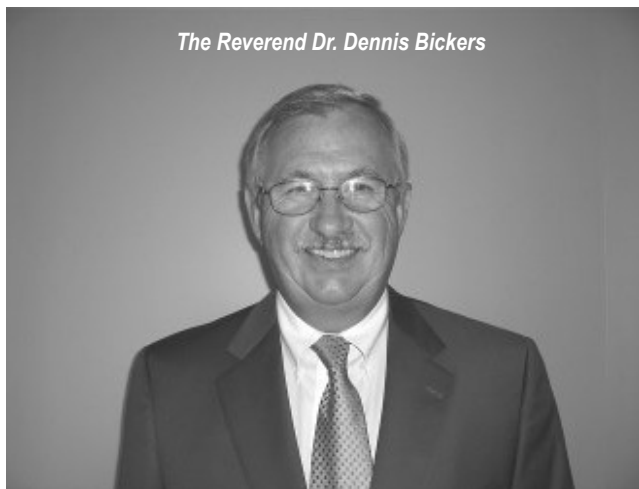

ABC-IN/KY Staff Members Announce Retirement Plans

ABC of IN/KY is preparing to celebrate the ministry careers of The Reverend Dr. Dennis Bickers and The Reverend Dr. Jim Walter in two separate events in November. The two have served their entire ministry careers in Indiana - a total of 74 years combined. Both have announced their plans to retire on December 31, 2015.

The Reverend Dr. Dennis Bickers



Bickers served Hebron BC for twenty years, beginning in 1981, before joining the IN/KY staff as area (now resource) minister in 2001. Most recently, Bickers has had primary responsibility for all southern Indiana churches, and all of Kentucky. He is a popular seminar leader and preacher, and is considered a national authority on bi-vocational ministry. Bickers is the author of numerous ministry related books and articles, and maintains a blog in which he connects with ministry leaders from around the world.

Walter began his ministry as an Associate Pastor at Meadowbrook BC in Anderson (1975-1979), and then, served Federated Church of Brookston from 1979 to 1988. In 1988, he joined the IN/KY staff, first as Manager of the former Indiana Baptist Assembly and later as Minister of Camping. In 2004, Walter began serving as an area (now resource) minister, primarily with churches in northwestern and western Indiana. Likewise, he is a popular preacher and seminar leader, and has worked tirelessly to develop creative strategies in areas such as technology, discipleship & leadership, youth ministry, and church governance.

As I write on this crisp, almost-fall afternoon, my mind is meandering towards the celebration of World Communion Sunday. Celebrated across the world on the first Sunday in October, we are reminded that as one body in Christ, we worship in different cultures, languages and traditions. We approach God's global table from distinct ethnic and ancestral traditions, yet celebrating as one, the spiritual heritage we share in the breaking of bread and drinking of the cup.

At the same time, my heart is torn even as my eyes have been drawn to images of thousands of Syrian refugees fleeing all they have known for a hoped-for sanctuary of which they do not know. Their stories are horrendous, multiplied by the terrors they encounter, sleeping on bare ground, huddled with hungry and thirsty family members, searching for safety while carrying their little ones and assisting the frail and sick among them.

How grateful I am that ABC International Ministries missionaries, Larry and Becky Stanton, are in Hungary. Larry has had the opportunity to work alongside IM's partner, Hungarian Baptist Aid, to

distribute food and supplies to those who are in need. In a very real sense, Larry is extending the Lord's table as he distributes food and supplies, sharing the love of Jesus in this most desperate of situations.

Most of us know several refugees. They live among us. The woman and child fleeing a violent home; the young person, bouncing from family to family in the foster care system; the co-worker attempting to shake the grip of addiction; the parents grieving the death of a child are all a type of refugee¹ living in our midst. These are people we know. Sometimes, "they" are us – ourselves, our friends, our loved ones. Some of us struggle to know how to share authentically, in the midst of these situations. Yet, our very best selves desire to extend the love and grace of Jesus as we welcome them to our tables.

Then, there are the refugees who now live near us (or soon will). People seeking a better life in our nation and communities, having fled horrors of which we cannot imagine in their countries of origin. They may be Syrian ...or anyone who is "different" than we are. I wonder...are we preparing to welcome them to our tables?

At the Lord's Table, there is always room – and enough for more. Even as we take our place at the Table, Jesus challenges us to scootch over to make space for another, and another, and another. In spite of what we think or hear in the media, believers in Jesus are not hindered by scarcity. There is no good reason as believers in the One Who is the Creator and Owner of all, to be fearful that there is "not enough."

As we prepare to celebrate World Communion Sunday, or any time of communion, may we take our place, make space for another, and extend grace to the other as we are Together on God's Abundant Journey.

**And the table will be wide.
And the welcome will be wide.
And the arms will open wide
to gather us in.
And our hearts will open wide
to receive.**

**And we will come
as children who trust
there is enough.
And we will come
unhindered and free.
And our aching will be met
with bread.
And our sorrow will be met
with wine.**

**And we will open our hands
to the feast without shame.
And we will turn toward each
other without fear.
And we will give up our
appetite for despair.
And we will taste and know
of delight.**

**And we will become bread
for a hungry world.
And we will become drink
for those who thirst.
And the blessed
will become the blessing.
And everywhere will be the
feast.²**

Many CLI students choose to complete their credentials in Christian Leadership and Pastoral Studies after getting a taste of the challenge, excitement, fellowship and support the CLI experience brings. It isn't required for participants to commit to a specific program or to earn credit. There are individuals who participate in CLI for enrichment, and yet, others who audit class sessions, but choose not to earn credit. CLI also welcomes participants from any Christian denomination as well. CLI instructors are individuals from our American Baptist family who are

committed to an active relationship with ABC ministries in our Region. CLI instructors are very qualified to teach the topics they do and are committed to helping students grow.

The program that was designed for any Christian is made up of eight courses and allows the student to earn their Certificate of Christian Leadership. The second program includes those eight courses, and adds five additional courses that focus more specifically on the foundational areas of Christian Ministry. After completing these 13 courses, one earns a Diploma of Pastoral Studies. This diploma is not just for Professional Church Staff, but for anyone who is called, preparing, or is a leader in ministry. It is merely an "educational foundation" to pastoral ministry. Deacons, committee chairpersons and ministry leaders find value in earning this diploma.

Ultimately, the church and its ministry benefit from the training of its leaders. It is an investment that bears fruit for years to come. As Zig Ziglar puts it, "The only thing worse than training (leaders) and losing them is to not train them and keep them!"

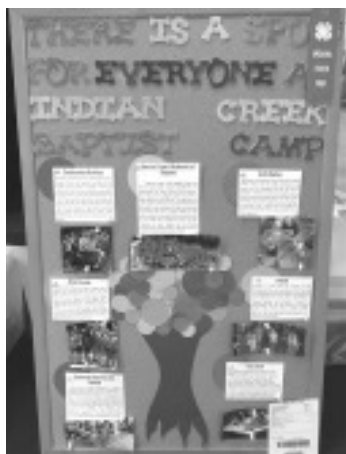
