Technology Opens Up CLI to Additional Students



A long term goal for CLI became reality during the Fall Quarter as ABC-IN/KY experimented with a new way to participate in classes using Zoom Video Live Streaming. Rev. Dr. Darrell James and Rev. Tim Mohon teamed up to teach "Church and ABC History" to a total of 18 students. While eleven students preferred to commute to the ABC-

IN/KY Region Office to experience the class in person, seven additional students were able to participate from home or their church using this technology. Three individuals participated from home in Gary, Kokomo and Warren; plus, a small group of four from Liberty Center Baptist Church came together in an equipped classroom provided by the

church.

Phyllis Goodyear, who retired from the ABC-IN/KY Staff in December 2018, served as a technology coordinator to assist in implementing this new project. She provided orientation and technology support to students applying to participate via Zoom and for the instructors in the classroom. An additional benefit of this technology allows for recording the class segments, which were made available to registered students for a period of 30 days after each scheduled class session. This was especially helpful for students who needed to earn an excused absence to keep them eligible for earning credit for the full class.

Church Leadership Institute (CLI) is a ministry of

American Baptist Churches of Indiana and Kentucky, in cooperation with ABC-Greater Indianapolis that has been growing, equipping and enriching Christians for nearly two decades. Individuals are invited to register for any class topic as an enrichment student, commit to the Leadership Program or the Ministry Program or audit class sessions as desired. 2019 IN/KY Ministry in Review

Christmas 2019 will soon be here and perhaps, by the time you read this, we will have entered 2020. I am enjoying a review of our IN/KY ministry in 2019 in a way similar to my process for writing a Christmas letter of greeting that accompanies the cards Homer and I send to friends and family. Here are a few highlights that stand out to me.

We are grateful for grants (received over several years) from the American Baptist Foundation (ABF) that have provided seed money and program funds for region priorities and region pathways. Former staff member, Lianne Wright, continues to serve on the ABF Board, and Debra Schill (Seymour) has provided ABF with leadership for the grant process.

Among those:

- ◆ The Latino-Anglo Bridgebuilders (LAB) provided cultural competency training for Anglo and Latino churches and pastors. An additional phase is being envisioned that would make this more accessible to churches or associations.

- ◆ The Teaching Church Initiative (TCI) is in its second year, with Scott Johannsmeier, Mark Kern, and Troy Burns moving forward with their M.A. degree classes, delivered through

Northern Live! Nick Estelle (New Castle FBC) began his studies this fall. If you would like information on TCI, please contact one of the region staff members.

- ◆ Travel funds are provided for pastors to participate in the Nehemiah Leadership Network, one of several initiatives for developing leaders. The final cohort includes Rodney Lynch (The Found at Purdue) and Dave Doles (Brookston Federated) who will join others in the program for a February 2020 retreat.

- ◆ Equipment necessary for video conversations and meetings was installed in the region office conference room earlier this year. Using technology, the region staff connects each month with thought leaders on a variety of topics that expand our horizons; people meet together virtually – or join a meeting for which they are unable to be physically present. A current CLI class is being delivered both in-person and remotely to participants in other locations.

- ◆ IN/KY was notified this fall that we, along with ABC-GI, will share in the most recent grant designed to provide leadership training and relational cohort groups specifically for bi-vocational pastors. More information will be available about this new initiative early in 2020.

I am grateful for the gifted leaders of IN/KY who share their expertise on region standing committees (Nominating, Finance, and Personnel), and the Region Board as they give guidance and oversight to this ministry. A few updates on board positions...Mark Thompson was appointed by the Board as Vice President last year (in the absence of anyone elected at the 2018 biennial). When he joined the ABC-IN/KY staff in August, he was no longer eligible to serve on the Board. The Board appointed Irina Sorrels (Hayden FBC) as Vice President to fill that open position. Janine Choate (Hopewell BC) resigned as Region Secretary due to an upcoming move from the area, and the Board appointed Melanie Zeiner (Plainfield FBC) to fill that unexpired term.

At that same meeting, the Region Board officially accepted three new churches into ABC-IN/KY. Two are in



Logansport (see my article in the previous *Observer*): Iglesia Bautista Esperanza (Jose' Troyano and Milagro Perez, pastors) and Zo Chin Christian Church (Mang Hau, pastor). In addition, Zo Chin BC in Fort Wayne (Cing Do Nang, pastor) was welcomed and a few of their leaders were able to be present. (see photo above). The ethnic diversity of our region continues to expand and I estimate that, on any given Sunday, our region churches worship in seven languages. We have much to celebrate and much to learn from one another!

The Wabash Leadership Program (www.wabash.edu/pastoral_leadership) is funded by the Lily Endowment to enhance excellence in ministry among a group of gifted pastoral leaders over a two-year period. John Campbell (Terre Haute FBC) and Lisa Williams Hood (Lafayette FBC) began their experience earlier this year, along with colleagues from other denominations. Issues surrounding immigration is one of the topics they have already explored and included a week-long trip to the southern border of the U.S. Both have expressed a willingness to share some of their learnings with interested churches or leaders.

The Ministerial Excellence Fund (MEF) provides much needed assistance to pastors, allowing them to better focus on their churches and ministry. Thus far in 2019, the MEF team has approved grants totaling \$59,363.80 for 3 pastors. Information about MEF can be found on our website.

In February, we welcomed John Dunlap as the Manager of Mission and Finance. He brings a wealth of experience in accounting and business

practices, in addition to a passion to use his gifts in mission and ministry. Mark Thompson joined us in August as Region Minister for churches in the central part of Indiana, bringing many years of experience in church ministry and

region leadership to this pastoral role. They have joined an immensely talented staff and it is my personal joy to see how God moves as we serve together. Dan Chadwick, Bruce Cochran, Jaime Flores, and Mark give of themselves wholeheartedly as together we provide consultation, resources and training in pastoral leadership, community mission engagement, congregational health, discipleship, generosity and governance. Jordan Morris and Rebecca Scott continue to faithfully lead our camping ministries, showing great love and care for kids and volunteers, their families and churches. Both camps are looking forward to construction projects that will enhance the property for campers and activities. Becky Septoski, Jennifer Greene and John serve everyone, staff and churches alike, using their unique gifts with a good dose of loving care and humor.

South Bend FBC Sells Building

South Bend FBC is now sharing a building owned by Crest Manor Church of the Brethren after the sale of their church building located on Ironwood Drive last August. They are now located on Berkshire Drive in South Bend.

On Sunday, October 20, 2019, members voted to donate 10% of each year's earnings from the proceeds to organizations or programs that create lasting connections and give an "above and beyond" gift. The first round of gifts will total \$32,000 and will go to five different organizations:

- ◆ Jr. Chefs - a community startup in conjunction with a neighborhood middle school to teach middle school students basic cooking skills;
- ◆ Broadway Christian Parish - a

local UMC ministry that ministers to the impoverished and homeless in the city;

- ◆ Rainbow Acres - an American Baptist residential ministry in Camp Verde, Arizona for adults with developmental disabilities;
- ◆ Camp Tippecanoe - one of the ABC-IN/KY camps;
- ◆ Supper Church - a small, one-time donation to start up a new South Bend FBC outreach ministry.

South Bend FBC is looking at their surrounding community and denominational partners to find ways in which they can both volunteer and contribute. The goal is the same as their mission statement: Connect with God, Connect with Others, and Connect Others with God.

“Consider” Playing for Gospel Outreach

Consider this: what would a church’s reaction be if their pastor was appearing in a rock band at a local brewery?

Well, if that church was Seymour FBC, and if the pastor were Rev. Dr. Jeremy Myers, and if the band was an instrument of evangelistic outreach called “Consider”, you might be surprised.

Senior Pastor Myers, Worship and Media Pastor, Nathan Parker and Family Life Pastor, Mike Lyon have played together for years, reaching back to college days, when they started playing for student events.

Over the years, they have written a lot of songs together, recorded a couple of short “demo” albums, and have played at youth retreats and different community events, including an addiction recovery rally.

Recently, when they got the chance to play at “Rails”, a local craft brewery and restaurant in Seymour, they were a bit concerned about how the church would respond.

Myers said from the very beginning, their goal as a band is to help people to consider Christ through music and performances.

The band’s name references Hebrews 12:3, “Consider Him who

endured such opposition from sinners so that you will not grow weary and lose heart.”

All of their original music is intended to reflect on how Christ has proven Himself real and faithful in their lives, to help others consider the presence of Christ in their own lives.

When the night of the performance arrived, the place was packed with people from the church, including the chairperson of every major committee.

“What was cool, they invited their friends who might not ordinarily come to church,” Myers said. “It was cool to see them get behind the gospel initiative. Our goal was to take the gospel into the community of Seymour.”

“It was really cool to see the people of the church be good with that and get behind that – of all ages, young and old,” he said. “There were school kids dancing while we played and there were senior adults that you would have never thought would darken the door of that place, bobbing their heads.”

The group also wrote and presented their own Christmas musical in December, both at the church and for the community, again at “Rails”.

They are in the process of recording another “demo” album.

Churches in Indiana Assemble Shoeboxes for Christmas Outreach

Miami BC “Shoebox Warriors” Packing With a Purpose!

In November, over 20 “Shoebox Warriors” met at Miami BC in Logansport to assemble shoeboxes for “Operation Christmas Child”. Many of the ladies of the church work year-round making gifts such as; clothing, dolls and blankets, pencil pouches filled with school supplies, fishing kits, sewing kits, even crocheted flying discs.



This year, the packing party was scheduled for 5 hours but lasted almost 7 – it takes a while to pack 275 shoeboxes! Since they blasted right past their goal of 250 Gospel opportunities, next year’s goal is 300! Michelle Harrison provided a lunch of homemade vegetable beef soup, warming the body as well as the soul.

“Operation Christmas Child” at Switz City BC

On Saturday, October 26, members of Switz City BC met to pack shoe boxes for “Operation Christmas Child”. Last year was the first time the congregation of 25 participated, preparing 22 boxes. This year, after a more concerted effort, 40 boxes were packed and \$360 was raised for shipping costs.
