WHAT TO LOOK FOR?

What is legit:

A legitimate scholarship provider sends information about awards only after you request it.

A legitimate scholarship organization makes its contact information available.

A legitimate matching company never guarantees that the student will win an award or that they will "do all the work".

A legitimate matching company knows that financial aid information is FREE and readily available in financial aid offices, libraries and on the internet.

A legitimate application requires information that is relevant to the award. Financial information is never requested.

What is not:

A scammer offers you an award for which you did not apply. Think: "How did they get my information?"

A scammer refuses to release the company's information, or may only provide a PO Box.

A scammer promises to do all the work for you (i.e. filling out applications, securing the funds, etc.). They often guarantee you win an award.

A scammer will tell you that you can't get the information they supply anywhere else. They may attempt to make you feel as though you'd be "missing out" if you didn't use their service.

A scammer requires personal financial data such as credit card or banking information to "verify" or "hold the scholarship".
