

Church & ABC History (American Baptist Polity Course)

CLASS HIGHLIGHTS:

- Learn about the New Testament Church, the historical church, and the emergence of Baptists in the seventeenth century
- Examine the arrival of Baptists in the US and the union of denominational life to foster common ministry
- Explore the history of American Baptists in Indiana/Kentucky
- Study current issues and the changing structure of American Baptists
- Focus on the meaning of call to ministry, ordination, and the structure of local church
- Identify Baptist principles, look at practical applications to these principles, and the tensions they sometimes create.
- This course is essential to pastors but helpful to laypersons as well
- Required for Ordination and M28 Certificate in Theological Education
- Continuing Education Units (CEUs) also available upon request.

WHEN IS IT OFFERED?

This course is usually offered annually and divided into four (4) <u>non</u>-consecutive Saturday sessions, virtually by Zoom; however, an individualized study, likely also held virtually, might be available upon request.
