One of the “great doors for effective service” (I Cor. 16:9) that has opened for me in the last couple of years is collaborating with our Baptist partners in Cuba. We have completed one rainwater harvesting project at a church camp, and another is currently underway, having begun during my last trip in February. **Barb is going to Cuba in October to introduce the Girls’ Clubs.**

Pastor Waldemar Murguido works with me there, coordinating transportation, creating introductions and partnerships with leaders and churches, and welcoming me into his churches and family. He works at the seminary, and pastors two rural churches on weekends. Without a car, he must rely on hired drivers and, given the current economic situation in Cuba, this is becoming too expensive to maintain.

His own vehicle, such as a simple, three-wheeled, four-person, gas-powered vehicle will make his ministry economically feasible.

I wholeheartedly support this appeal, and I know it will open doors for more effective service. All we need at the moment is \$3,500 dollars.

Please accept fraternal greetings from our church in Cuba.

Trusting in providence and solidarity among peoples, we write to you with the hope of sharing an urgent need we are experiencing, which, with your help, can become a beautiful opportunity for service and unity.

Our Christian communities have grown in recent years, and with it have also grown our pastoral activities, visits to the sick, work with children and youth, and accompaniment to remote communities that depend on our spiritual and human presence. Today, we need a means of transportation that allows us to fulfill this mission.

Currently, we do not have our own transportation. We are forced to rely on irregular public transportation or rent expensive transportation, which seriously limits our reach and exhausts our scarce resources. A tricycle, ATV, electric bicycle, or hybrid bicycle, although modest, would allow us to:

- Visit sick and elderly people who cannot come to church.*
- Bring food and medicine to rural communities.*
- Facilitate the transportation of children, catechists, and volunteers for training activities.*
- Provide support in times of emergency (hurricanes, power outages, etc.).*

How can you help us?
