What Gift Will You Bring Others?

Just like that, Christmas is here again. Likely, your living room has a lovely Christmas tree displayed, stockings are hanging from the mantel, and your favorite winter candle is lit. You may have a list of gifts left to purchase and a plan for the last few weeks of this year. Hopefully written into the plan includes a few church services, maybe even a special Christmas service or worship night. That is fantastic!

However, I'm worried that we're too casual about Christmas. Christmas today seems to represent a society that emphasizes purchasing the nicest, most expensive gift. You are probably now waiting for the line about how Jesus is the best gift you could ever receive. While that is true, that isn't the goal of this article.

Instead, let's focus on this moment in the Christmas story, specifically Luke 1:26-38, where Mary, the mother of Jesus, learns she is about to conceive a child. This moment comes as a surprise, considering she is a virgin. An angel comes and tells Mary not to be afraid of what is about to happen. The angel says in verse 30, "Do not be afraid, Mary; you have found favor with God."

In the sixth month of Elizabeth's pregnancy, God sent the angel Gabriel to Nazareth, a town in Galilee, to a virgin pledged to be married to a man named Joseph, a descendant of David. The virgin's name was Mary. The angel went to her and said, "Greetings, you who are highly favored! The Lord is with you." Mary was greatly troubled at his words and wondered what kind of greeting this might be. But the angel said to her, "Do not be afraid, Mary; you have found favor with God. You will conceive and give birth to a son, and you are to call him Jesus. He will be great and will be called the Son of the Most High. The Lord God will give him the throne of his father David, and he will reign over Jacob's descendants forever; his kingdom will never end."

How will this be," Mary asked the angel, "since I am a virgin?"

The angel answered, "The Holy Spirit will come on you, and the power of the Most High will overshadow you. So the holy one to be born will be called the Son of God. Even Elizabeth your relative is going to have a child in her old age, and she who was said to be unable to conceive is in her sixth month. For no word from God will ever fail."

"I am the Lord's servant," Mary answered. "May your word to me be fulfilled." Then the angel left her.

Mary served as the fulfillment of a prophecy. She was the vessel for bringing the Son of God into this world. She stood afraid. Afraid of the implications, the risk and the judgment she would surely face. This moment changed everything. I'm sure at some point she would have thought, "Are you sure about this, God?"

I don't know that I've related to the Christmas story more than I do in this moment. I often feel like things around me are changing, probably for the better. Usually, however, I find myself asking God, "Are you sure about this?"

We all have similar moments. Right before a breakthrough, there is a pivotal point where we have to choose surrender. That was happening for Mary; she had to surrender her plans so she could literally nurture the Savior of the world.

Although we will never be given the same circumstances and call as Mary, we face a similar task. We are required to be a vessel for the Son of God.

I can't help but wonder what would be different during this Christmas season if we focused on the gift of salvation as much as we did on the ones placed under the tree. Yes, we will have to face our fears, and likely an angel won't appear.

The urgency is the same. Just as Mary was the vessel for bringing Jesus into the world, we must be vessels for bringing him to the world. This is far greater than any gift, Christmas party, or scented candle could ever be.

This is eternal life. Immanuel, God is with us, entered this world through a virgin's womb so he could save each and every one of us. Our great and wonderful commission is to spread that message to all nations. We can't lose sight of the true reason for the season.

So Joseph also went up from the town of Nazareth in Galilee to Judea, to Bethlehem the town of David, because he belonged to the house and line of David. He went there to register with Mary, who was pledged to be married to him and was expecting a child. While they were there, the time came for the baby to be born, and she gave birth to her firstborn, a son. She wrapped him in cloths and placed him in a manger, because there was no guest room available for them.

And there were shepherds living out in the fields nearby, keeping watch over their flocks at night. An angel of the Lord appeared to them, and the glory of the Lord shone around them, and they were terrified. But the angel said to them, "Do not be afraid. I bring you good news that will cause great joy for all the people. Today in the town of David a Savior has been born to you; he is the Messiah, the Lord. This will be a sign to you: You will find a baby wrapped in cloths and lying in a manger."

Suddenly a great company of the heavenly host appeared with the angel, praising God and saying, "Glory to God in the highest heaven, and on earth peace to those on whom his favor rests."

When the angels had left them and gone into heaven, the shepherds said to one another, "Let's go to Bethlehem and see this thing that has happened, which the Lord has told us about."

So they hurried off and found Mary and Joseph, and the baby, who was lying in the manger. When they had seen him, they spread the word concerning what had been told them about this child, and all who heard it were amazed at what the shepherds said to them. But Mary treasured up all these things and pondered them in her heart. The shepherds returned, glorifying and praising God for all the things they had heard and seen, which were just as they had been told.
